Booking Details

Please call 0488 662 783 to make a booking for your child. Alternatively you can email bookings@schoolsupportservices.com.au Bookings can only be made when a previous account has a zero balance, we cannot accept bookings that have an outstanding balance. We require an Online enrolment form for each child that attends vacation care. If you have not already completed the Online Enrolment form you can find this at www.schoolsupportservices.com.au Children must be aged between 5-12 years and enrolled in primary school to attend the vacation care program.

Cost of Program

The daily cost of vacation care is \$63.67 per day/per child when booked before the school holidays commence.

Bookings made after the school holidays commence are \$68.67 per day/per child.

CCS is available for eligible families.

Once a booking is made, the fee will be applied to your account and cannot be cancelled. If your child does not attend, they will be marked as absent which will incur the daily charge.

Invoices are sent out to the email account nominated on your child's enrolment form.

Payments are to be made by Ezi Debit (direct debit) through the Xplor System

Additional Information

Lunch boxes

It's important to provide a balanced lunch and snacks for your child that will last them the entire day. Please remember that too much is better than not enough, so an extra piece of fruit is encouraged.

We have morning tea/lunch/afternoon tea breaks throughout the day. Meal times are progressive and children can choose to eat when they are hungry.

We have a fridge for snacks to be kept cool; however we are not able to heat or re-heat items so please keep this in mind when packing your child's food for the day. We provide breakfast if required and a seasonal fruit platter for afternoon tea.

Clothing

Our sun smart policy states that children must wear sleeves (no singlets please) and hats (wide brimmed or legionnaire) at all times whilst outside.

Please provide sunscreen in your child's bag just like a normal school day.

We will be playing sports, running and climbing so please ensure your child wears appropriate footwear. Please label your child's belongings.

Technology

We <u>no longer</u> allow children to bring their own technology device to our programs. The program on offer focus' on learning through play! Group educational sessions on the interactive whiteboard may be offered in the program, which will be facilitated by an educator.
